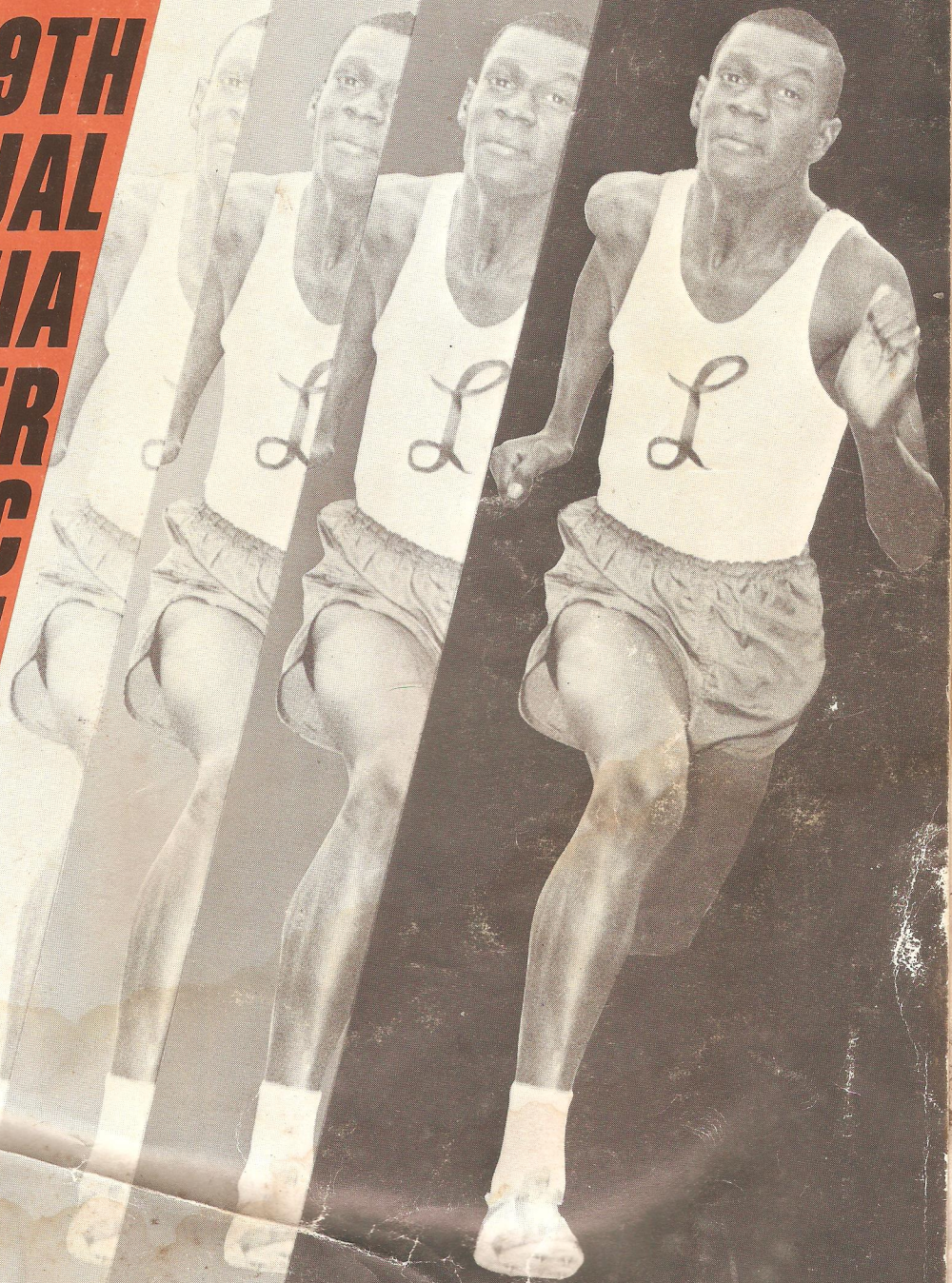

ABOUT THE CIF

The California Interscholastic Federation was formed in 1914 when it was agreed by officials of state high schools that the athletic program should be under the control of the administration in California high schools.

The general purpose of the CIF is to make possible uniform practices in conducting athletics in all parts of the state, to centralize control and foster clean, sportsmanlike competition and conduct.

Mr. William Russell, CIF commissioner, has an excellent background in athletics and administration.

Bill Russell was an outstanding athlete at Santa Barbara State College (now UC Santa Barbara). He later served as graduate manager at his alma mater and commissioner of the CIF, Southern Section, before being appointed commissioner of the state CIF.

Bill also serves on many National Federation of State High School Athletic Association committees, plus being chairman of the National Alliance Track and Field Committee.

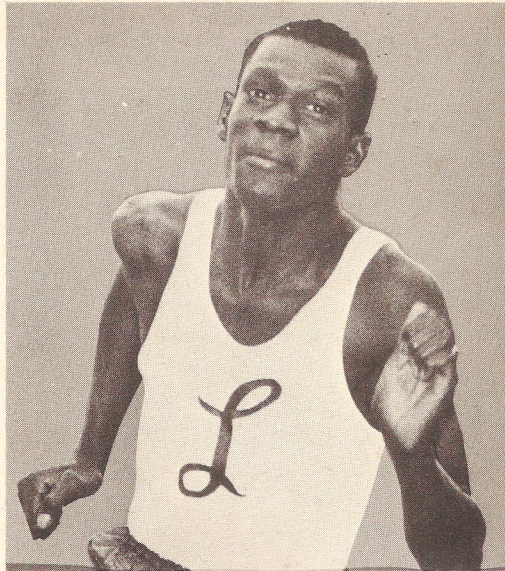

COVER—Otis Martin, 9:01 two-miler from San Diego Lincoln, will be among favorites in eight-lap race. He finished fifth in 9:10 last year behind recordbreaking Ralph Gamez of Berkeley. He also qualified for state meet as sophomore in 1965, placing 12th.

Dave Snyder, one of the most respected men in the administration of California high school athletics, is honorary referee for the 1967 California Interscholastic Federation track-and-field championships.

Snyder, director of physical education in the Oakland Public Schools, is retiring this year after a distinguished, 39-year teaching career.

Born in Troy, Ohio, he attended public schools in Dayton, Ohio, and later was graduated from Antioch College, Yellow Springs, Ohio.

In 1928, Snyder took a teaching position at University High in Oakland and never left the East Bay city.

He was named supervisor of physical education in Oakland in 1936, a post he held three years. In 1940, Dave Snyder was elected to his present position as director of physical education.

He also has served as president of the California Department of Health, Physical Education and Recreation, CIF federated council, Football Rules Committee and "Certification of Merit" National Federation.

He was manager of the first two day state meet in Berkeley in 1963. He also managed the 1957 meet.

It is, indeed, a pleasure for the CIF SDS, to have Mr. Dave Snyder with us at the 49th state track championships.

Sitting a few steps off the pace are some very strong darkhorses, Gardena, El Cerrito and Montgomery of Santa Rosa.

Dorsey of Los Angeles took the team championship with 22 points last year as sprinter Phillip Underwood and hurdler Donald Parish carried the load.

The talent runs so deep in 1967, however, that it doesn't look as if any of the contenders will pull together that many points.

It is not because they don't have the firepower. Muir, which finished second to Centennial in the Southern Section meet, conceivably could do it with one man, Jerry Proctor.

Jerry scored in four events last year and may repeat.

He's topspeeded with his pending national record of 25 feet, 7 inches, in the long jump.

He has the best time, :13.9, in the 120-yard high hurdles and he's run :18.6 in the 180-yard lows on the straightaway, a time matched on the curve by Gardena's Wayne Collett.
