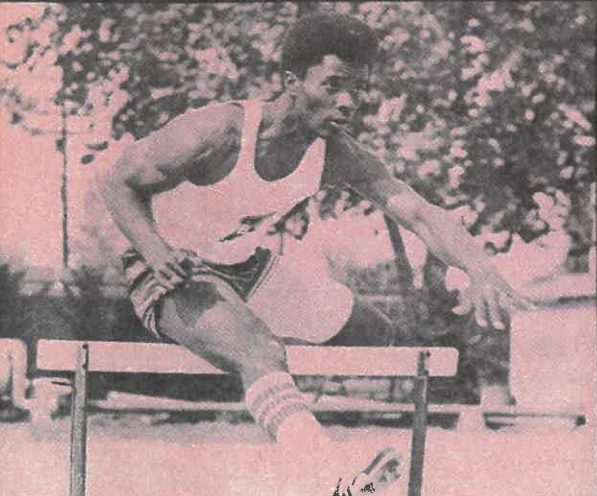

A WIDE OPEN STATE MEET

Speed wins the race. If speed can win the 1971 California high school track and field championship, Hamilton High of Los Angeles may be at the top of the heap. The Yankees' one-two punch of David Thomas and George Reddick may just be enough. Thomas won three events in leading Hamilton to a runaway win in the Los Angeles City Section meet, and Reddick shares the best 100-yard dash time in the nation this year, a 9.4 run earlier.

Not to be discounted are the one-two finishers in the tough Southern Section meet, Lompoc and Dominguez (Compton). Lompoc, a surprise winner in the sectionals, is led by hurdler Charles Jackson, a threat to double. He has a highs best of 13.8. Dominguez has two relay teams entered, plus pole vaulter Michael White, SS winner, with a lifetime best of 15-2.

Cropping up as the outstanding events are the 440, where the prospects are for a mid-47s champion, and again this year the two-mile. The Southern Section sets the pace in these two events. In the SS 2-mile finals, sixth place was 9:05 and didn't qualify for the state meet. The SS has the only three to qualify under 48 in the quarter, too. And Dwight Stones of Glendale could become the fourth straight state champion over seven feet in the high jump. He's cleared the height already this year.

In store this weekend, as usual among California high school athletes, is a tremendous show.

Honorary Referee

Edwin A. Hendrix, Superintendent of Sutter County Schools, and State CIF President, is the Honorary Referee for the 1971 California State High School Track and Field Championship Meet. Mr. Hendrix has maintained a keen interest in and support of inter-scholastic athletics since his days as an undergraduate student in high school and college, where he participated in both track and field and cross country at Chico State.

Ed began his teaching career in Northern California at the elementary level, also serving as elementary principal for 7 years. For approximately 20 years he served as district superintendent and principal of Live Oak High School. Since 1962 Mr. Hendrix has served as the Sutter County Superintendent of Schools.

Ed has provided outstanding service to pupils and schools with his untiring efforts to widen the opportunity for boys and girls to participate on school sports teams. From 1946 to 1957 he served as a member of the CIF Northern Section Board of Managers, having been elected to that post by the Principals of the other high schools in the league. In 1957 the Principals and Superintendents on the NSCIF Board of Managers elected Mr. Hendrix to serve as the CIF Section Secretary and Representative to the State CIF Federated Council. Under Mr. Hendrix's leadership and guidance the Northern Section CIF and the State CIF have expanded their athletic programs, operating them in such a manner that they have been commended for their efficiency.

Mr. Hendrix is concluding his third consecutive one-year term as President of the State CIF Federated Council. State CIF by-laws provide that no person may serve as an officer of the State CIF Federated Council for more than three consecutive one-year terms. Mr. Hendrix's designation as Honorary Referee of this year's State CIF Meet, which is being hosted by the CIF Southern Section schools, could not be more appropriate.

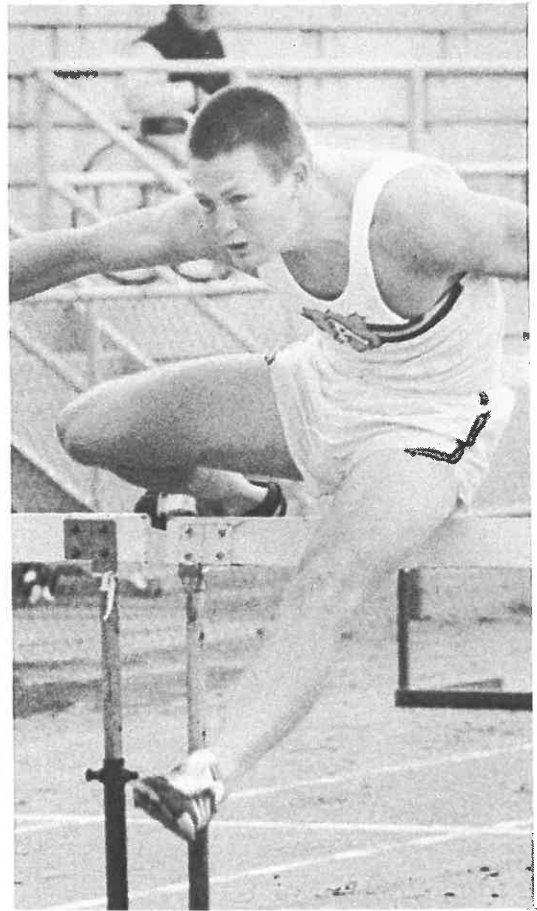

GERALD MAC DONALD, Los Angeles City Section, has coached at Carson High School since the school opened in 1962. After attending Notre Dame on a track scholarship, MacDonald spent eight years in the Marine corps. His current crop of track athletes took the over-all team title at the Rolling Hills Invitational and his cross country teams of '69 and '70 won league titles, going all the way to the section crown in '69. Among the standouts coached by MacDonald were Ralph Mann, world record holder in the intermediate hurdles, and Ron Carver, now a football star at UCLA.



ROGER SNIPE, North Coast Section, has enjoyed tremendous success at St. Helena High School, going undefeated in dual meets and league championships over the past 11 years. In 26 years of coaching in Northern California, his teams have won more than 70 relays and invitational titles, including four at the Davis Picnic, one of the state's largest prep meets. His efforts have been instrumental in upgrading cross country and track programs among small schools.



JOE BROOKS, San Diego Section, has served as track and cross country coach at El Capitan High School, Lakeside, for the past 16 years, establishing a log of 103 wins and 50 losses in track. He has coached state meet representatives 13 of the past 16 years, with particular success in the pole vault and distance races. His cross country teams have captured two Southern Section and five San Diego Section titles over the past 14 years and his teams have compiled a 124-30 won-loss mark.

HARRIS FLOWERS, Oakland Section, has been producing winners since 1938, when one of his students was Tennessee mile champ. Before coming to Castlemont in 1969, he coached Madison Jr. High to championships in sports from ping pong to football and at the same time tutored the Oakettes AC (a girls team) and the Trojans AC (a boys age group team). Among the national class athletes who have performed under Flowers are hurdler Milton Turner, and middle distance ace Nathan Burks, now at USC. Third in the state meet last year, Castlemont had a junior relay team with a 41.2 best.



MURL DODSON, Central Section, served as track coach at Kingsburg High School from 1938 to 1956, after brief stints at Parlier and Taft. Upon his retirement from coaching, Dodson has served as referee at many valley and regional meets. His most famous product is former Olympic decathlon champion Rafer Johnson. He also coached Jim Johnson and Monte Clark, who went into pro football, as well as Clarence Treat and Bob Wiley. Murl is retiring this year after 38 years of teaching, 23 of them also spent coaching track and field.

DUTCH ROHWER, San Joaquin Section, is currently track chairman for the section, as well as serving as athletic director and golf coach at Woodland High School. In 29 years, he has coached every sport but wrestling. Completing his 20th year at Woodland this season, he's the organizer of the Woodland Invitational Track Meet, billed as the largest single-day prep event in the nation. Each year, more than 50 high schools and 1,200 athletes participate in the meet.



California's 10 CIF Section Honor Coaches



BILL GILL, Southern Section, is currently track coach at Hawthorne High School, after enjoying a tremendously successful 15-year career at Centennial High in Compton. That tenure was capped by his being honored as national "Coach of the Year" for 1969. Gill's Apache teams won three state championships, five CIF's titles and eight league crowns. Among the standout athletes he's coached are Charlie Dumas, first to clear seven feet; Preston Griffin, co-holder of the national prep 100 mark; and Edesel Garrison, current USC star.

LEO LONG, Central Coast Section, is coach of the defending state champion Los Altos High track team. The former NCAA javelin champion (1954) began coaching at Los Altos in 1958 and compiled a 110-3 won-lost dual meet record, winning the league championship every year at the school. He spent four years coaching in Argentina. Long has tutored national record holders, Bob Stoeker and Chris Adams in the discus. Standout on his 1970 team was Rick Brown, the 440 and 880 winner now at Cal.

NORM MAC KENZIE, North Section, doubles as track and varsity football coach at Las Plumas High School in Oroville. After graduating from Chico State, where he was a hurdler, he began coaching at Oroville HS in 1956, moving to the new Las Plumas HS after it was built in 1961. A busy man, MacKenzie also is athletic director and department chairman for P.E. and has served five years on the North Section track committee. He'll be director for the 1972 state CIF track meet at Oroville.



HARRY REDLICK, San Francisco Section, has mentored the Washington High School track and field and cross country teams for 14 years, compiling a record of 101 wins and 38 losses in varsity competition. Under Redlick, the Eagles have captured three city and section championships, and also the cross country team has a pair of section titles to its credit.
