Honorary Referee



Guy Wrinkle

Guy Wrinkle, Commissioner of the CIF Los Angeles City Section, and Director of Interscholastic Athletics for the Los Angeles City Schools, is the Honorary Referee for the 1972 California State High School Track and Field Championship Meet. Mr. Wrinkle has maintained a keen interest in and support of physical education and interscholastic athletics since his days as an undergraduate student in high school and college where he participated in football, basketball, track and tennis.

After graduation from U.C.L.A. in 1936, Guy began his teaching career at Hollywood High School and has served the Los Angeles City High School District since that time.

Mr. Wrinkle served in the Navy for three years during World War II, entering the service as an apprentice seaman and advancing to the rank of lieutenant commander. After his Navy service, Guy returned to Hollywood High School where Wrinkle-coached teams won eight championships in varsity basketball in twelve years and reached the Los Angeles City Championship finals five times. His Hollywood High School tennis teams won numerous league championships, as well as three CIF Los Angeles City Section Championships.

Guy has served as manager of the State CIF Championship Track and Field Meet on two occasions, administering in a most efficient and friendly manner the multitude of duties in connection with such a large and important meet. As Commissioner of the CIF Los Angeles City Section, Mr. Wrinkle is a member of the State CIF Federated Council where he has generously given of his abundant energy and wise counsel to the expanding athletic programs on a statewide basis. The designation of Mr. Guy Wrinkle as Honorary Referee of the 1972 State CIF Track Meet, which is being hosted by the CIF Northern Section schools, could not be more appropriate.

In 13 years, Hedges has coached 14 young men who bettered the 4:25.0 mark in the mile while in high school. An additional six have been under 4:30. His top performers were Carl Trentadue, and Mike Solomon. In cross country, Hedges has coached three section champions and a runner-up. His teams captured eight Sunset League harrier titles and one track top spot. Hedges has served with distinction, managing a Sectional preliminary meet each of the last 10 years.



DEAN BALZARETT, Los Angeles Section, has been the cross country and track coach at James Monroe High School since 1967. The cross country team has won three league titles and they were the Los Angeles City runner-up in 1967 and 1969. The Monroe Track team has currently won three consecutive league titles. Jim Estes, the California State Junior College mile champion in 1969, and Tim Quinn, a senior student and California State pole vault champion, are his two most outstanding athletes. The Los Angeles City Track Quarter-Finals were initiated in 1969 and he served as one of the meet managers from 1969 through 1971. He is currently serving on the seeding committee for the Los Angeles City Schools Track and Field Championships.



STERLING MACFARLANE, North Coast, has given 31 years of dedicated service to high school athletics. Eleven highly successful years of coaching in Idaho preceded his tenure at Pittsburg High School where as coach, and later as principal, "Mac's" keen interest in boys, and sincere enthusiasm for the sport, elevated the Pirates to a position of dominance as one of the track powers of the greater Bay Area. As a veteran member and officer of the Section Board of Managers, "Mac" also served several terms on the C.I.F. Federated Council and is a recipient of the C.I.F. Honorary Award. He is currently the Director of Personnel for the Livermore Valley Unified School District.

VINCE SEMPRONIO, Northern Section, has been Track Coach and Athletic Director at McCloud High School since 1959. His varsity and J.V. track teams won six championships since the Evergreen League track meet was inaugurated in 1967. He has been a member of Northern Section C.I.F. Track Committee since 1968, President of the Evergreen League two years, 1969-70 and 1970-71, director of the Siskiyou Division Sub-section Track Meet for six years, and Charter member of California Coaches Association, Siskiyou Chapter.

JIM ECHOLS, Oakland Section, is currently Athletic Director and Track Coach at Oakland Technical High School. In four years he has compiled a 45-7 won-lost record in dual meets and finished second in the Oakland Athletic League in all four years. He has coached State Meet Representatives each year, with particular success in the mile relay. Jim is now serving as President of the California State Athletic Directors Association.

DONALD GILBERT, San Joaquin Section, has been coaching track since 1950. At Rio Linda Junior High School, his teams won three consecutive league championships. He compiled an outstanding record at Grant High School. At Highlands High School since 1958, his varsity cross country teams have earned 9 championships and his track teams, 6 championships. His top athlete was Rick Elliott who later starred at UCB.

MR. CHUCK WEINMANN, Central Section, has coached track at East Bakersfield High School since 1957. In addition he coached in Idaho, the Military Service, and Arvin High School in Kern County, California. He also is a strong worker in the "Fellowship of Christian Athletes Program." During his coaching span of 20 years, his teams have won several CIF Central Section Track Championships as well as many South Yosemite League Titles. Under his tutelage many track athletes have well represented East Bakersfield High School and the CIF Central Section.



BILL KEARNEY, Central Coast Section, is Principal of Alisal High School in Salinas, California, and President of the Monterey Bay Athletic League. From 1948 to 1959 he was track coach at Salinas High School. His varsity track team won 11 consecutive League Championships and his lightweight team 9 League Championships. During his tenure the varsity track team was undefeated in dual and triangular meet competition. His teams were noted for their tremendous depth, balance and sportsmanship. He thoroughly enjoys his present participation in track as a referee, starter, and consultant for local, as well as League, Regional, Sectional and P. A. A. U. age-group Championship Meets.

GEORGE WHITE, San Francisco Section, began coaching at Balboa High School in the San Francisco Section in 1964 as head track coach and assistant varsity football coach. His league dual meet record presently stands at 50 wins and 5 losses and his teams have a total dual meet record of 75-12. His varsity teams have won three section championships and six dual meet championships in the past eight years. George directed the first annual A.A.A. relays for San Francisco and Balboa High School won both the varsity and sophomore divisions. White has been instrumental in organizing and directing the San Francisco Police League summer track and field programs in the past seven years.



ED TEAGLE, San Diego Section, Mar Vista High School, Imperial Beach, California, has been coaching track for 16 years. His teams have won 8 championships with unblemished records each of these years. His overall record is 98-23-1. Hurdles and pole vault are his specialties, taking league hurdle championship 10 out of 16 years and league pole vault championship the past 6 years. Some of his outstanding athletes are Mike Griffith, Mike Lemms, Dave and Dan Helton, Wolfgang Weichert, Valley Coleman, and Marty Hauck.
